35	II.16	Supplemental Items	The Justice Administration Department (JAD) shall, in conjunction with the Commissioners Court Analyst's Office (CCAO), (i) identify best practices and make recommendations for effective alternatives to punitive criminal justice responses to address poverty, homelessness, public and mental health, substance of use, and violence prevention, (ii) identify best practices and make recommendations proven to reduce criminal justice system involvement, improve community health, and reduce racial disparities in our justice system, (iii) analyze the short and long-term cost effectiveness of current criminal justice approaches to community safety and wellness, compared to potential non-criminal justice intervention alternatives, (iv) make recommendations concerning the continued investment in or reallocation of resources from existing criminal justice system strategies and the investment in or allocation of resources to non- criminal justice system programs and structures that further these goals.

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			The JAD and the CCAO shall provide preliminary responses within 30 days with preliminary findings, recommend next steps to complete the analysis, and additional resources needed to expedite the process. Upon completion of a final report, there shall be a public hearing to present findings. The County shall put a marker down for an initial 25 million dollars in funding for programs that meet the minimum standards established by JAD and the CCAO for non-justice system alternatives. At least 5 million of those funds will be made available as grants to cities within Harris County that implement qualifying programs. The JAD shall establish standards and qualifications for the programs and guidelines for how to allocate grants to cities based on size and demonstrated need for such programs. Any programs recommended by the report and budgets for such programs will be implemented only after being
			approved by Commissioners Court.
