### **County Clerk Reminds Citizens that Election Day is Saturday, May 3**

**(HARRIS COUNTY, TX)**—On Saturday, May 3, 2025, Harris County will conduct a joint election involving 46 entities, including cities, school districts, community colleges, and other districts.

Voters can cast their ballots at any of the 187 vote centers across Harris County. The polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Harris County Clerk Teneshia Hudspeth urges voters to confirm if they reside in an area where an election is being held. [Click here to view voter-specific ballots.](#)

“Every election matters, especially those shaping the future of communities across our county,” **said Clerk Hudspeth.** “Turnout tends to be lower during local elections, which means your vote has a greater impact.”

#### **Election Day Tips**

- Voters can take written materials, including sample ballots, into the voting booths. Sample ballots are available for viewing and printing at [www.harrisvotes.com/voter/whats-on-my-ballot](http://www.harrisvotes.com/voter/whats-on-my-ballot).
- Electronic devices, including phones and cameras, are not allowed in the voting area.

#### **Acceptable Forms of Photo ID**

- Texas Driver’s License issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS)
- Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS
- Texas Personal Identification Card issued by DPS
- Texas Handgun License issued by DPS
- U.S. Military Identification Card with photograph
- U.S. Citizenship Certificate with photograph
- U.S. Passport (book or card)

Voters who do not have one of the approved forms of photo ID may complete a Reasonable Impediment Declaration (RID) at the voting center and provide an alternative form of ID, such as a utility bill, bank statement, government check, or voter registration certificate.
