### **Harris County Clerk's Office to Conduct Logic and Accuracy Testing Ahead of November 4 General and Special Elections**

**(Houston, TX)** – The Harris County Clerk's Office (HCCO) is committed to ensuring secure, fair, and impartial elections by conducting logic and accuracy (L&A) testing on Tuesday, September 16, 2025. The testing will take place at the Harris County Elections Headquarters located near Bush Intercontinental Airport.

“With this being the 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive election since the Clerk's Office reassumed election responsibilities in 2023, this process goes beyond mere regulatory compliance,” **explained Harris County Clerk Teneshia Hudspeth**. “It is an integral part of our mission to guarantee that every eligible voter in the county participates in a trustworthy democratic process.”

L&A testing verifies that all electronic voting equipment functions accurately, recording and tabulating ballots in compliance with the Texas Election Code and federal election regulations. To promote visibility and accountability, representatives from the Republican and Democratic Parties observe every step of the process.

“The integrity of our democratic process begins with transparency. Logic and accuracy testing is vital in ensuring fair and secure elections in Harris County,” **added Clerk Hudspeth**. “By demonstrating the reliability of our voting equipment, we reinforce trust that every ballot will be counted accurately.”

Below are some important election dates:

- **October 6** Last day to update voter registration status
- **October 20** First day of early voting
- **October 24** Ballot by mail application deadline
- **October 31** Last day of early voting
- **November 4** Election Day

The November 4, 2025, General and Special Elections ballot includes contests for 17 amendments to the Texas Constitution, Congressional District 18, City of Houston At Large Position 4, local offices, school board positions, municipal utility districts, and community college trustees.
