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Harris County Wraps Up November 4 General and Special Elections

(HOUSTON, TX) – The Harris County Clerk’s Office (HCCO) has posted the unofficial results for the November 4, 2025, General and Special Elections on HarrisVotes.com, with **440,570** voters casting ballots on a wide range of local and statewide issues.

This year’s ballot featured 17 proposed amendments to the Texas Constitution, a special election for Texas’s 18th Congressional District, and several local races, including city council positions, school board trustees, and municipal propositions.

Key Highlights from Harris County:

- **Congressional District 18:** Will proceed to a runoff election, expected in January 2026.
- **Houston City Council At-Large Position 4 and HCC, Trustee, District II:** Will advance to a runoff election on December 13, 2025.

Harris County saw strong voter participation, recording the **second-highest turnout for an odd-year election in 25 years**. Official results will be certified following the completion of canvassing procedures in the coming days. Newly elected officials will assume office according to their respective schedules, and approved propositions will begin implementation as outlined by state and local laws.

“We extend our heartfelt gratitude to every election worker and volunteer who made this election a success,” **said Harris County Clerk Teneshia Hudspeth**. “More than 6,600 election workers staffed 600 vote centers across Harris County on Election Day, to ensure a smooth and secure voting experience for all.”
